Overview & Objectives	
Learning objectives	This exercise provides a good basis for challenging values and attitudes and can give trainers evidence in assessable training
Learning outcome	They should be more aware of their own and other people's values and attitudes and question these in an appropriate manner. Greater awareness of CP procedures
How does the selected approach fit with the learning outcome?	The approach uses adult learning theory/experiencial learning. There is often no right or wrong answer to the scenarios, encouraging participants to take part fully in discussion and explain their views.
