




He let me warm up in his car


He said I'd freeze

# There are adults who are on the look out for your group like you:

- they will often try to make friends with you and may seem really nice and kind;
- they may buy you presents or give you food, drink or drugs. They might let you stay at their home;
- \* they will want something in return.

## They might want to use you for sexual acts to please themselves or their friends:

- they can be very persuasive. Things can easily get out of your control;
- they might threaten you or tell you that you will get into trouble if you tell anybody. They might tell you that nobody will believe you;
- you might feel ashamed or embarrassed about telling somebody;
- you might be worried that you will get into trouble if anybody finds out.

### If you do find yourself in a situation like this:

tell an adult who you trust about it
(someone in your family, a social worker,
school teacher etc); If you are not sure about
who to trust, ring one of the telephone numbers
on the back of this leaflet:

there are people who can help you make sense of what has happened to you

- you are the victim
- you have not committed a crime
- you will be believed and listened to
- you will not be judged
- you will be safe from harm.
